Most Reverend Richard C. Hanifen, Bishop Emeritus of Colorado Springs - Campaign Co-Chair - Phase II

Bishop Hanifen was installed as the founding Bishop of the new Diocese of Colorado Springs in January 1984. He was ordained as a priest for the Archdiocese of Denver in 1959, the same year he earned his Masters in Theology from Catholic University in Washington, D.C. Bishop Hanifen retired in January 2003.
