



The Self Sufficiency Center

The current Marian House facility will be demolished and rebuilt once the new kitchen facility is completed in May/June 2008. This new facility will house services intended to support people striving to gain personal and economic self-reliance through a combination of case management and direct services, provided in an environment which affirms the dignity of the individual. Catholic Charities and affiliated programs housed in this facility will include:

Marian House Client Services

- Case Management
- Clothing Closet (clothing & emergency supplies and services)
- Information & Referral
 - Referrals &/or job training opportunities
 - Alcohol & drug rehabilitation programs
- Help with IDs

Marian House Community Outreach

(provided to people who cannot access services at our facility or other providers)

- Case Management
- Food, household items, furniture
- Information & referral
- Clothing

Life Support Center

(emergency basic needs assistance to families with children)

- Case Management
- Baby food, formula, diapers
- Clothing (children's and maternity)
- Car Seats & instruction
- Baby furniture
- Birthday Buddies & Christmas gift program

Agency Connections Bus

- Transports people to providers to access services

Medical Services

- On-site medical clinic operated in collaboration with S.E.T. of Colorado Springs
- Medical Mobile Delivery services operated in collaboration with Peak Vista

Potential Office Space Partnerships

- *Urban Peak*: Office daily 11 am—1pm
- *VA Clinic*: Office 2 days a week for 2 hours around the mealtime
- *EP County Health Department*: Office 1—2 days a week (not necessarily at mealtime)
- *ESM*: Office daily—3 hours around mealtime

Potential Transition Services

- *Partners in Housing*
 - PIH will collaborate with MH & ETS to provide Life Skills training & classes
- *Ecumenical Social Ministries*
 - Housing specialist will be on site to help get people into housing
- *Pikes Peak Community Action Agency*
 - Opportunity for collaboration with programs already established at Norvelle Simpson such as GED, PPCC connections (help with career path), IDA (Individual Development Accounts)

Potential Emergency/Stabilization Services

- *Urban Peak*
 - Outreach to the young people
- *VA Clinic*
 - Outreach to Veterans on site to determine qualification for services
- *Medical Clinic*
 - SET of Colorado Springs on site with possible expanded hours
- *EP County Health Department*
 - Outreach in the community to engage, then use MH office space for counseling
- *Other potential collaborations*
 - Pikes Peak Mental Health, Colorado School of Professional Psychology, Social Security, Dept. of Human Services.
