Safeway & Hormel Foods to Deliver Peanut Butter to Help Families in Need

Colorado Springs CO - Safeway and Hormel Foods will deliver 500 jars of SKIPPY Peanut Butter - a staple for most households, but certainly for anyone trying to make ends meet – at 8:30 a.m., March 9, to the Marian House Marketplace food pantry. This donation, part of the SKIPPY Gives program, is a partnership between Hormel Foods and Safeway to provide needed protein to hunger-relief organizations. Marian House is thrilled to be the beneficiary of this outpouring of generosity.

Employees from Safeway and Hormel Foods will be at the Marketplace pantry to help unload the cases of peanut butter and help stock the shelves of the pantry. An average of 25 families "shop" for free each day, taking home about 10 days' worth of food for their families.

This is not the first time Safeway and Hormel Foods have been responsible for such a generous donation to the Marian House. In addition to regular donations throughout the year, Safeway & their customers donate holiday meals cards for families to use in their local Safeway stores. Hormel Foods also previously donated over 900 hams at Christmas for struggling families.

"The Marian House Marketplace gives families the dignity to shop for their own groceries and we are excited to give families the option of choosing a protein like SKIPPY Peanut Butter," said Kris Staaf, Sr. Director of Public Affairs for Albertsons/Safeway.

"We continue to be blessed by the generosity of Safeway, their customers, and partners. These donations go directly to the families and individuals who shop at our Marketplace food pantry, where 100% of the food is donated," said Andy Barton, CEO of Catholic Charities which operates the Marian House Campus.
