Catholic Charities of Central Colorado Launches Digital Equity Program Kickoff Scheduled Aug. 31 at Hillside Community Center

Colorado Springs, CO – (Aug. 22, 2023) Catholic Charities of Central Colorado is launching a **Digital Equity Program** (**DEP**), thanks to a grant from the City of Colorado Springs. The program will launch with a Kickoff event at Hillside Community Center on Aug. 31, 2023, from 6 - 7:30 p.m.

The DEP will help bridge the digital divide by helping residents without connected devices or who lack basic digital skills not only learn those skills but also have access to the internet, thanks to the Community Economic Defense Fund Affordable Connectivity program which helps people sign up for affordable internet services. We anticipate participants of the program will be people who are low-income and housing-insecure living within Southeast Colorado Springs and who have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and the increased digitization seen in its aftermath.

The DEP is a perfect supplement to services already offered at the Hanifen Employment Center (HEC), adding support for navigating the technology required to access employment, housing, financial assistance, and benefits. The existing in-house computer lab will be bolstered by 10 traveling Chromebooks, and both will offer one-on-one tech support, workshops, and courses to increase digital skills and access resulting in participants gaining new skills, support, and information. Classes will be delivered at Catholic Charities HEC and through our mobile computer lab, currently scheduled for Hillside Community Center, Deerfield Hills Community Center, Meadows Park Community Center, and Relevant Word Christian Cultural Center. Catholic Charities' goals for the program include:

- Providing workshops and one-on-one technical support to 160 individuals each year.
- Having 60 individuals participate in the computer literacy course and learn basic computer skills including internet literacy, Google Docs, and email proficiency.
- Having 30 individuals complete the full DEP with certifications (these individuals will receive a free Chromebook).

The program will utilize the NorthStar Curriculum. NorthStar is a Minnesota-based company whose mission is to share the power of learning through education, community building, and advocacy. Northstar was developed in response to the needs of job seekers who lacked the digital literacy skills needed to seek, obtain, and retain employment and perform other daily life tasks. The certification for the DEP will come from Northstar, whose certificates will provide important credentials for employment.
